Tanzania's Eastern Safari Circuit boasts Oscar nominated scenery around Kilimanjaro, from Arusha to Zanzibar: The 2 or 3 weeks safari itinerary features a four to six night HATARI experience around Kilimanjaro: from the lush green rainforests of Mt Meru surrounded by craters, lakes and endless savannas to the wide and open spaces of the Masai plains. To the newly appointed Mkomazi National Park which borders only behind the horizon and stretching out to the Usambara Mountains. Through lowland coastal forest, acacia woodlands and dry river beds cooled by the gentle breeze from the Indian Ocean touching the Saadani National Park. All ending with a unique beach experience on the unspoiled coast of Tanzania – only a Dhow trip away from the picturesque Stone Town of Zanzibar.

DAY 1

DAY 1

Arrival at Kilimanjaro airport. Transfer by car through Arusha National Park to Hatari Lodge (60 mins). Depending on the time of arrival, lunch or dinner as well as late dinner will be served at the lodge. In the afternoon, sundowners on the wooden platform or at the Momella lakes Viewpoint. "The sun disappeared behind Mt. Meru... The snows of Kilimanjaro reflected in the dark mirror of its granite peak. Happy who may live here. Live! In the real sense of the word." (Translated from the novel: "Meine Farm in Afrika" by Hardy Krüger; Lübbe Publications.) Dinner and overnight at Hatari Lodge.

DAY 2

DAY 2

After breakfast early morning start through the fragile mountain forest on the slopes of Mt Meru. Drive to the Kitoto viewing point where you will walk to the Crater floor at 2,600 metres. Picnic lunch with a spectacular view. Return to the lodge for an afternoon siesta, tea, coffee and cake. Dinner and overnight at Hatari Lodge.

DAY 3

After breakfast full day game drive in Arusha National Park to Ngurdoto Crater – a hidden secret untouched by people. Enjoying spectacular scenery from various viewpoints along the crater rim – habitat to a wide range of birds and the longhaired Black and White Colobus Monkeys followed by a three hour walk along a crater track reaching Leopard Point where a picnic lunch awaits you. In the afternoon game drive through 'Little Serengeti' and returning to Hatari Lodge. Dinner and overnight at Hatari Lodge.

DAY 4

This morning you will be taken on a short game drive to the Momella lakes for a morning's canoe trip. Picnic lunch on the shores before returning for a leisurely afternoon at the lodge. Dinner and overnight at Hatari Lodge.

DAY 5

Morning at leisure or taking part in the historical Momella tour. After lunch, game drive via the open Ngassurai plains – Hatari's "private Serengeti". The game here is widespread. You arrive at our Shu'mata Camp (former Kilimanjaro Safari Camp), in time for sundowners. Dinner and overnight at our Shu'mata Camp

DAY 4

DAY 6

Early morning sun rise over Kilimanjaro. Tea is served at your tent. Foot Safari with Maasai warriors and a guide to a secluded spot for a bush breakfast. From here we visit a local Maasai engang (optional). Lunch is taken back in camp. Afternoon game drive and a Hemingway sundowner overlooking our own "private Serengeti" in the shadow of Kilimanjaro. Night game drives can be arranged. Dinner and overnight at our Shu'mata Camp

DAY 5

DAY 7

After breakfast transfer to Kilimanjaro Airport for a small charter hop over the Pare Mountains to the Mkomazi National Park. Arrival for lunch. Mkomazi lies between Kilimanjaro and the Indian Ocean and together with Kenya's Tsavo National Park compromise one of the largest protected wilderness ecosystems in Africa. Sundowner walk to the Baobab viewpoint overlooking the endless carpet of acacia trees and commiphora brush stretching out to the horizon. Dinner and overnight at Camp.

DAY 6

DAY 8

Early morning visit to the famous Rhino sanctuary of 30 square miles, managed by the Tony Fitzjohn/George Adamson African Wildlife Preservation Trust and home to eight rhinos. Tea and coffee within a special viewing bunker constructed by Tony near a waterhole to view these magnificent animals, whose ancestors roamed the earth for 60 million years. The day spent within the sanctuary having a picnic on one of the many slopes overlooking the vast land of Mkomazi. Dinner and overnight at Camp.

DAY 7

DAY 9

Palm trees sway in a cooling oceanic breeze. White sand and blue water sparkle alluringly beneath the tropical sun. Traditional dhows sail slowly past, propelled by billowing white sails, while Swahili fishermen cast their nets below a brilliant red sunrise... but then suddenly these idle hours of sunbathing might be interrupted by an elephant strolling past, or

a lion coming to drink at the nearby waterhole! ...Let's Go after breakfast with another charter hop by plane to Saadani National Park – where the beach meets the bush! The only wildlife sanctuary in East Africa to boast an Indian Ocean beachfront, it possesses all the attributes that make Tanzania's tropical coastline and islands so popular with European sun-worshippers. Dinner and overnight at the Safari Lodge.

DAY 8

DAY 10-11

Today, a surprisingly wide range of grazers and primates are seen on game drives and walks, among them giraffe, buffalo, warthog, common waterbuck, reedbuck, hartebeest, wildebeest, red duiker, greater kudu, eland, sable antelope, yellow baboon and vervet monkey. Herds of up to 30 elephants are encountered with increasing frequency, and several lion prides are resident, together with leopard, spotted hyena and black-backed jackal. Boat trips on the mangrove-lined Wami River come with a high chance of sighting hippos, crocodiles and a selection of marine and riverine birds, including the mangrove kingfisher and lesser flamingo, while the beaches form one of the last major green turtle breeding sites on mainland Tanzania (Enjoy a game drive in the morning and a sundowner cruise on the Wami river in the afternoon! Or a walk on the beach before a dip into the ocean!). Dinner and overnight at the Safari Lodge.

DAY 9

DAY 12

After breakfast another charter hop by plane to the Pangani Coast – featured by the London Times as one of ten of the world's most unspoilt beaches. Arrival in time for lunch on a crescent of white sandy beach, washed by the gentle surf of the Indian ocean, fringed by coconut palm trees. Afternoon at leisure. Dinner and overnight at the Beach Lodge.

DAY 10-11

DAY 13-17

While relaxation is the keynote, a full range of water sports such as scuba diving (possibility of getting training at all levels from PADI Open Water Diver to Dive Master), sailing, surfing, snorkeling, fishing and kayaking are also on offer. All activities are optional and not included. Dinner and overnight at the Beach Lodge.

DAY 12

DAY 18

Morning at leisure before a short charter hop by plane over to the magical Stone Town on Zanzibar Island. In Stone Town, one can spend many idle hours wandering through the narrow labyrinthine streets and alleyways, enjoying the many historical buildings, the ocean cuisine and go wild shopping for souvenirs. Dinner and overnight in Stone Town.

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DAY 19

Various activities can enrich your time in Zanzibar. Cultural and historical recommendations are a guided tour through

The rate includes: accommodation and full board lodging at the following Unique Safari Lodges/Camps: Hatari Lodge 2 or 4 nights; Shu'mata Camp 2 or 3 nights, Mkomazi National Park 2 nights, Saadani National Park 2 or 3 nights and a beach experience 3 or 7 nights. The last 1 or 2 nights in Zanzibar Stone Town only include breakfast.

Further the rate includes all game driving and walking activities as mentioned above as well as canoeing & river cruise on the Wami. Park fees are included as well as airport transfers and inland schedule and charter flights between the mentioned destinations. At some of the lodges the house wine and mineral water on the rooms as well as during activities are included.

Not included are International and domestic flights to Tanzania, Visa, all alcoholic and soft drinks, Tips and personal expenditures. Daily Activities during your stay at the Swahili Coast and in Stone Town are not included.

The safari is also offered in opposite direction from Zanzibar around Kilimanjaro back to Zanzibar and highly recommended.
